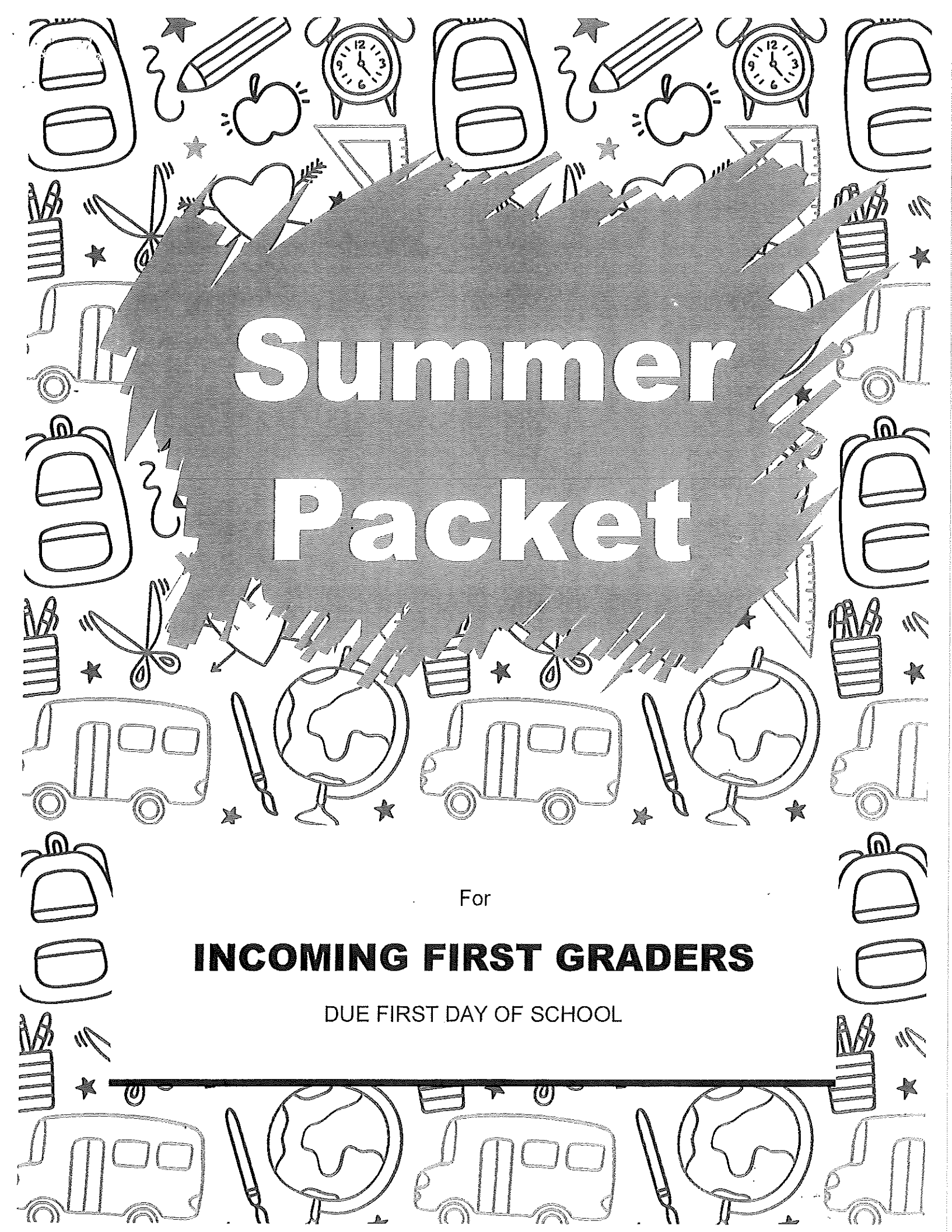

To My Incoming First Graders,

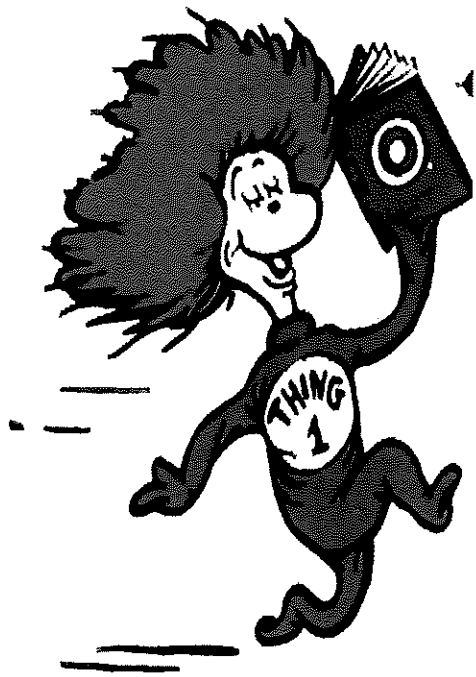
